

Lyric, a second-grader experiencing reading difficulties, finds an unexpected teacher in Mr. Hartley, the school janitor. Through the help of his made-from-junk robots, Mr. Hartley mentors Lyric, fostering her confidence and equipping her with the tools needed to overcome her reading challenges.

With catchy melodies and a folk guitar score, *Lyric & the Keys* is a new musical celebrating what it means for young people to believe in themselves enough to do anything – even learn to read. The key has always been inside!

CREATE A CONFIDENCE CAT!

In *Lyric and the Keys*, the title character finds support from a friend named CC, or Confidence Cat. CC is a **robot** created by Mr. Hartley, the school janitor, from **recycled materials** and helps Lyric build her confidence!

Robotics is the combination of science, engineering, and technology to create machines programmed to replicate, substitute, or assist humans in completing tasks of varying complexity. These machines are known as robots!

Recycling is the process of collecting and processing materials that would be thrown away otherwise and turning them into new materials! Just like what Mr. Hartley does with discarded materials in the show!

Hemisfair is known for its unique art! Many of the art pieces, including our steel drums, are both interactive and beautiful.






REPURPOSE AND DECORATE A GONDOLA!

In the show, Mr. Hartley repurposes recycled materials and turns them into robots! **Repurposing** means taking something old or used and giving it a new life by turning it into something different! See the coloring activity below and decorate a gondola!

Our gondolas originate from the Brackenridge Sky Ride of 1963. The ride was 100 feet in the air and stretched from the zoo to the Japanese Tea Gardens. The Sky Ride was a fun attraction for visitors of the World's Fair, and today the gondolas serve as the perfect place to take a break at Hemisfair.

ROCK & ROLL VS FOLK MUSIC STYLES



The term "Rock & Roll" dates all the way back to the 1920s when Trixie Smith recorded, "My Baby Rocks Me with one Steady Roll" in 1922. Combined with its distinct style that utilizes heavy beats and lots of electric guitar, the Rock and Roll genre has been a symbol for independence and teenage rebellion since World War II.

Folk music is a broad musical genre that encompasses traditional music from an array of populations and ethnic groups. It includes several genres including Appalachian music, bluegrass, railroad songs, protest songs, cowboy songs, sea shanties, jug music, and more! The main characteristics of folk music are acoustic instruments, English language lyrics, and emphasis on regional authenticity.



Brain Break Activity: Using the links below, have your students freestyle dance along with the music and pause it at random intervals. When the music is paused, the students must freeze until the music begins again!

THIS IS A...



In the show, Mr. Hartley helps Lyric use her imagination to make one object into something new in the game, "This is A..." Follow the directions below to play the game yourself!

What You'll Need:

A space large enough for a standing circle, a bag of miscellaneous objects

Directions:

- 1. Have the class form a standing circle.
- 2. Each student will pull an object from the bag of miscellaneous objects.
- 3. Once each student has an object, give them a moment to use their imagination to think of what else the object could be. (For example, a toothbrush could suddenly be a telephone!)
- 4. Next, go around the circle letting each student say "This is not a [insert object here]. This is a [insert new object here]."
- 5. After each student shares, the entire group repeats what they just did!
- 6. This pattern repeats until everyone has shared!

Extension Activity: To challenge your students, give the group one object that they must pass around and create new objects for. Once they have mastered this, take away the physical object entirely and have them practice their pantomime skills to communicate what the new objects are!



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS



A Q+A or brief discussion will take place immediately following the performance.

At the end of the show, please remain seated as the cast will lead the audience through a talk back. Talk backs provide a further shared experience about the themes woven throughout the show.

Some questions you may hear are...

- Lyric has a lot of responsibilities at home. How do you think that makes her feel? Have you ever been overwhelmed by your responsibilities? What is something you can say or do when you're feeling overwhelmed?
- In the show, Lyric struggles with reading and being confident. But then with the help of a trusted adult and the Confidence Cat "CC" Lyric learns how to be more confident and improves her reading skills. Have you ever had someone there to help you face a challenge? How did it make you feel to have someone help you when you needed it?
- Mr. Hartley is a trusted adult that Lyric goes to for help. Think for a moment of some trusted adults in your life that you can always go to for help. This could be adults both at school and at home.
- Ms. Reed has a hard time seeing Melody's perspective on Lyric's situation.
 Have you ever had a hard time seeing someone else's point of view?



Think about some questions you'd like to ask about the show, like how or why we did something! We will give you the opportunity to ask some of those questions.
